 The internet has changed and continues to change, impacting markedly on the psychology of all people - young and old. While there is no obligation for schools to become part of what is increasingly being called the 'fifth world', it needs to be understood and analysed. This is a one day masterclass where one of Australia's highest profile psychologists answers all these questions and more... He shares the latest research and trends as well as trying to predict the near future.

Session 1 - 9.30am to 11am: Dr. Carr-Gregg explores the different social networks and informs the participants what young people are doing online in 2012. He produces a number of key facts/figures and case studies which highlight some of the key avenues for cyberbullying and as a consequence the non-negotiable need for cybersafety.

Session 2 - 11.30am to 1.00pm: Dr. Carr-Gregg speaks about the greatest challenges facing our youth of today. He poses a number of significant questions that really test and challenge the participants, their role in the classroom and the implications for their progression. Some of these questions include: How should schools handle mobile phone policies? Can there be a happy marriage between Facebook and homework? How do schools get parents to take responsibilities with respect to the online world seriously? Have you ever heard of crowd sourced content, livestreams, video agitation, niche networks, blog platforms or social bookmarking?

Session 3 - 2pm to 3.30pm: Dr Carr-Gregg draws together some of the key elements of creating a Masterclass in Cybersafety. He stresses the importance of becoming an e-smart school. While there is no obligation for schools to become part of what is increasingly being called the 'fifth world' it needs to be understood and analysed, Eg, What is Cybercitizenship? Do teachers know of such things as nemophobia, phantom blackberry, vibration syndrome, binge texting, textosis, textaphrenia, textiety or repetitive thumb syndrome?
