CURRICULUM: A WAY FORWARD

The Primary Curriculum Team provides school support, professional development and assistance with resources, working collaboratively with principals, curriculum support teachers and other teaching staff in our schools.

Principals and Curriculum Support
Teachers new to their role in 2015
were provided with the opportunity
for an induction day, establishing
networks and developing a greater
awareness of the history and journey
travelled for curriculum development
in our Diocese.

As we welcomed teachers to our schools who were beginning their professions in education, professional development was offered to develop a network of people who were available to assist teachers when necessary, discussing curriculum and pedagogical practices that have been implemented across the Diocese. Resources such as as the Curriculum Place, Staff Portal and Units of Work for the Australian Curriculum Learning Areas were highlighted alongside major projects for example the MAGS.

Each year we continue to strengthen our professional learning and

knowledge of practice as educators. All primary classroom teachers attended a one day session prior to school on Visible Learning-Feedback. This area of development met the needs of many staff with feedback on the whole asking for additional professional development in this area in the future.

Teachers who would like to access further reading are able to locate a copy of John Hattie's book "Visible Learning for Teachers" which was provided to all schools.

In 2015 all schools will be using the Student Reporting System. As some of our schools are new to the system, a two day session was held

in February to assist staff with readiness for Semester One Reports in June.

eLearning Teachers from each of our primary schools enjoyed the opportunity to collaborate during their Term 1 Meeting, gaining further insights into future directions. The opportunity for further discussion and the sharing of wisdom in relation to pedagogical practices, resources and ergonomic awareness were just a few of the sessions that teachers took

a deeper level of knowledge back to their schools.

Associate Professor Maree Dinan Thompson conducted a well received professional support day based on effective assessment and criteria sheet writing.
